About The University Of St Andrews

The University of St Andrews offers a unique combination of ancient and modern, local and global. Teaching began in the community of St Andrews in 1410, and the University was formally constituted by the issue of a papal bull in 1413, when university status could only be conferred by the Pope, the then Bishop of St Andrews sought a blessing from Pope Benedict XIII to establish a national university in his home town.

St Andrews is Scotland's first university and the third oldest university in the English-speaking world. The city is quite small, unique and captivating place, and the University is a key part of its charm. Seven centuries of history link the students with the town, leading to the ancient and yet modern institution apparent today.

About St Andrews

St. Andrews is a seaside town northeast of Edinburgh, on Scotland's east coast. It's known for its many golf courses, including the Old Course, with the landmark Swilcan Bridge at the 18th hole. The British Golf Museum chronicles the history of U.K. golf. On a headland nearby are the ruins of St. Andrews Castle, with its medieval bottle dungeon. Close to the castle is the University of St. Andrews, founded in 1413.

With its roots stretching back to medieval times, you won't be short of things to do in St Andrews. There is a host of brilliant attractions to choose from, from family-friendly spots to historic wonders, as well as an abundance of stunning beaches, parks and fantastic walks to explore.

Old Course

The Swilcan Bridge and Hell Bunker are recognised across the globe, yet the greatest feature of the Old Course is that despite its grand status, it remains a public golf course, open to all.
